Dear Friends,

Llanpumsaint church has stood proudly in this village since the 6<sup>th</sup> century, it's an important historical and spiritual landmark. If the stones of the church could speak, they would tell of life and death, of unions, and of Gods family. Over the years our church has been a lifeline in times of trouble, a space for thanksgiving and celebration in good times. Its door is always open to friends old and new. Over the last few years, our congregation has reduced in size, however, we remain devoted to being the body of Christ as a part of the wider community of Llanpumsaint. Being a small congregation means we have to work hard to maintain our mission projects, ministry, and fundraising to ensure our building remains in good order, and our bills are paid. At the beginning of this year, the Diocese of St Davids began to look at all of the church of Wales worshipping communities across our diocese, the initiative is called pruning for growth. An initiative created in response to the financial position all churches find ourselves in, as so many local organisations are. We as the nine churches in our Local Ministry area, Bro Caerfyrddin, have spent time looking at ourselves from a missional, worshipping, and financial point of view to establish a plan to enable us to hopefully continue to be a part of the communities in which we as the people of God serve. Here in Llanpumsaint, we are struggling to survive and estimate that closure may have to occur within the next two years if we cannot improve our financial position and increase our numbers. We wanted to let you, our community, know of our struggles.

If you wish to support us, please consider becoming a part of our family; joining us in all that we are. If you feel becoming a part of our church family isn't for you, please do consider attending one of our fundraising events, they are full of friendly people, good things to eat and sometimes items to purchase.

This sadly is the situation that many churches currently find themselves in, this year our running expenses will total £18,500 and our reserves are diminishing, we cannot see any other way forward but to ask for your help and support so that our doors may remain open here in Llanpumsaint.

## 16 Llanpumsaint Biodiversity

### Wonderful Fungi

Autumn is the time of the fungi. They rise up from the earth, mysteriously, in a myriad of shapes, sizes and colours. They are the digesters of everything that lives and dies. Without fungi, we would be buried beneath vast mountains of putrid dead plants and animals. They are nature's great re-cyclers. They create soil, they turn all those leaves, all those dead trees, into nutrients from which new life can sprout.

And yet many people fear them, and think they are poisonous, unless they have arrived on a supermarket shelf. But many wild fungi are edible, and easy to identify. Chanterelles grow under beech trees, are wrinkly and bright yellow. Wood hedgehog is delicious, and the spines underneath its creamy cap make it impossible to mistake. The Cep, or "Penny Bun" has a brown top and yellow sponge beneath.



Many are simply beautiful. The wax-caps which only grow in traditional grassland, can be bright scarlet, orange, yellow or pink, as in the lovely "ballerina" which really looks just like a corps de ballet has landed. Some are spectacular, such as the bright red Amanita with the white spots – not as deadly as its close relative, the Death Cap, which looks quite unassuming. This year, unfortunately, has seen widespread honey fungus, which can eat up not only dead, but also living trees. It can spread for miles, can't be stopped in its tracks until Mother Nature herself does the job. If you're interested, get a good guide and learn to identify the toxic ones first and then the edible ones.

## 17 West Wales Dowsers

Dowsing is an interesting practice almost anyone can learn. It's thought to have originated in Egypt of even earlier. Many companies use the services of experienced dowsers to search for water, minerals, oil, electricity cables etc. Some dowse the safety of their food, or check for geopathic stress in the area, but this is a personal belief not yet scientifically proven. Want to learn? Our field trips are best, or we may have time after a meeting.

Meetings are held on Sundays at 1.45pm for a 2pm start at Bronwydd Hall. On Sunday September 28<sup>th</sup> our speaker was with Phil Cope, Cardiff born, photographer and author of many books including the Holy Wells of Wales. We heard about the characteristics of Well Spring Sites such as a natural spring may have been the first mirror with usually a settlement nearby. Most springs never freeze or run dry but just ebb and flow. Some have 'white water' others have 'red water' according to the minerals deep underground. Pilgrim routes often include well springs and pilgrims will make a special visit. Pagans believed they were protected by powerful natural spirits and Pagan sites of worship were recognised by early Christian Missionaries which then became Holy Springs such as St. Winifrid's in Holywell, Flintshire. Even today trees surrounding the sites can be seen with rags or 'clouties' tied to their branches.
